Assistance for Children with Severe Disabilities (ACSD)

Income dependent funding supplement for families

Child Must be under 18 years old.

Your eligibility and the amount of assistance you receive is based on a combination of factors:

- your household income
- size of your family
- severity of your child's disability
- extraordinary costs related to your child's disability

Income eligibility

You may be eligible if your total household income is \$74,760 or less. You must also meet other factors of eligibility.

Complete all sections of ACSD Application. Submit with the following documentation:

- Copy of your Canadian citizenship or immigration status in Canada
- Copy of your child's Canadian citizenship or immigration status in Canada
- Copy of your & your child's health card
- Copy of child's diagnostic documentation
- Copy of 2022 Notice of Assessment (showing line 15000) for yourself (if single), or

for you & your spouse (if married or in a common-law relationship even if \$0 amount)

- Copy of **2022 Canada Child Benefit (CCB) Notice** for the period July 2021 June 2022.
- SIN Number for you & your spouse
- •Bank information or a void cheque for direct deposit
